**W**HEREAS His Majesty has been graciously pleased, by Warrant under His Royal Signet and Sign Manual, bearing date at date at Carlton-House, the 9th of November 1820, to give and grant unto Francis Corbet, of Aclare, in the County of Meath, Esq. His Royal Licence and Authority that he and his Issue, and their Descendants respectively, take and use the surname of Singleton only, pursuant to an injunction contained in the last Will and Testament of the late Right Honourable Henry Singleton, sometime Master of the Rolls in Ireland, deceased; and also that he and they, respectively, may bear the Armorial Ensigns of Singleton quarterly with those of Corbet; provided that such His Majesty's Concession and Royal Declaration be first recorded and the Arms duly exemplified in the Office of Ulster King of Arms of all Ireland: Now these are to certify, that the same have been recorded and exemplified accordingly.
