WHEREAS His Majesty has been graciously pleased to grant to Arthur French St. George, of Tyrone, in the County of Galway, Esq. His

Royal Licence and Permission, that he and his eldest Male Descendant issuing from his Marriage with Lady Harriet St. Lawrence, Daughter of William, Earl of Howth, by his first Wife, Lady Mary Birmingham, Daughter and Coheir of Thomas, late Earl of Louth, and Baron of Athenry, deceased, may use and bear certain Supporters to his and their Armorial Ensigns, in token and remembrance of his descent from the Honourable Mary St. George, only Daughter and Heir of the Right Honourable George, Lord Baron St. George, and of the descent of the Issue of his before-mentioned Marriage from Thomas the said Earl of Louth and Baron of Athenry, provided that such His Majesty's Concession and Royal Declaration be first recorded, and the said Supporters duly exemplified in the Office of Ulster King of Arms of all Ireland: Now these are to certify and declare, that the same have been recorded and exemplified accordingly.
