WHEREAS His Majesty has been graciously pleased to give and grant unto Edward Michael Pakenham, of Castletown, in the County of Kildare, Lieutenant Colonel of the Donegal Regiment of Militia, His Royal Licence and Authority, that he and his Issue Male should take and use the Surname and Arms of Conoly, instead of those of Pakenham, in Compliance with an Injunction contained in the last Will and Testament of his Maternal Grand Uncle, the Right Honourable Thomas Conoly, late of Castletown aforesaid, deceased; provided that such His Majesty's gracious pleasure be recorded, and the Arms duly exemplified in the Office of Ulster King of Arms of all Ireland, otherwise the said Royal Licence and Authority to be void and of none effect; Now these are to certify and declare, that the same have been recorded and exemplified accordingly.
