**W**HEREAS, His Majesty has been graciously pleased, by Licence under His Royal Signet and Sign Manual, to give and grant unto William Sharman, of Stalleen, in the County of Meath, and of Crawford's-burn, in the County of Down, Esq. His Royal Permission and Authority, that he and his issue may, in compliance with an injunction contained in the last Will and Testament of John Crawford, late of Crawford's-burn aforesaid, Esq. deceased, take and use the Surname of Crawford, in addition to and after that of Sharman; and also use and bear the Armorial Ensigs of Crawford, in addition to and quartered with those of Sharman, according to the usage and laws of Arms; provided that such, His Majesty's concession and Royal declaration, be first Recorded, and the Arms duly Exemplified in the Office of Ulster King of Arms of all Ireland, otherwise the said Royal Licence and Authority to be void and of none effect:

Now, these are to certify and declare, that the same have been Recorded and Exemplified accordingly.
