

# ULSTER'S OFFICE,

*February 28, 1828.*

**W**HEREAS His Majesty has been graciously pleased, by Licence under His Royal Signet and Sign Manual, to give and grant unto John Hickson, (a Minor), second Son of John Hickson, of Dingle, in the County of Kerry, Esq. His Royal permission and authority, that he may (out of respect and grateful attachment to the memory of his maternal Uncle Richard Mahony, late of Dromore, in the said County of Kerry, Esq. deceased), henceforth take, use, and bear the Surname and Arms of Mahony, instead of those of Hickson; provided that such His Majesty's concession and Royal declaration be first recorded, and the Arms duly exemplified in the Office of Ulster King of Arms of all Ireland, otherwise the said Royal Licence and Authority to be void and of none effect:

Now these are to certify and declare that the same have been recorded and exemplified accordingly.
