WHEREAS the King has been graciously pleased, by licence, under His royal signet and sign manual, to give and grant unto Robert M'Causland, of the City of Dublin, Esq. Barrister at Law, sole heir and representative of his maternal grandfather, the Rev. Benjamin Bacon, late of Glebe-Hall, and Ballymacleary, in the parish of Magilligan, and County of Londonderry, Doctor in Divinity, deceased, His royal permission and authority, that he and his issue may take and use the surname of Bacon, and also use and bear the armorial ensigns of Bacon, instead of the surname and arms of M'Causland; provided that such His Majesty's concession and royal declaration be first recorded, and the Arms duly exemplified in the Office of Ulster, King of Arms of all Ireland; otherwise the said royal licence and authority to be void and of none effect.

Now, these are to declare and certify, that the same have been recorded and certified accordingly.
