WHEREAS the King has been graciously pleased to give and grant unto Thomas Young, of Lough Esk, in the County of Donegal, Esq. His Majesty's royal licence and permission that he and his issue may take and use the surname of Brooke only, and also use and bear the armorial ensigns of Brooke, in lieu of the surname and arms of Young, in compliance with a desire expressed in the last will and testament of Henry Vaughan Brooke, late of Manor Brooke, in the said County of Donegal, Esq deceased, provided that such His Majesty's concession and royal declaration be first recorded, and the arms duly exemplified in the Office of Ulster King of Arms of all Ireland; otherwise the said royal license and authority to be void and of none effect.

Now, these are to declare and certify that the same have been recorded and exemplified accordingly.
