WHEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by License under His Royal Signet and Sign Manual, bearing date at St. James's, the 14th of September last, to give and grant unto Percy Fitz Gerald, of Donore, in the County of Westmeath, Esq, his royal authority and permission, that he the said Percy Fitz Gerald, and his issue, might thenceforward in compliance with a certain injunction contained in the last will and testament of his grand uncle, Sir Peter Nugent, late of Donore

foresaid, Baronet, deceased, take and use the surname of Nugent in lieu of that of Fitzgerald; and also use and bear the armorial ensigns of Nugent, instead of those of Fitzgerald, provided that such His Majesty's concession and royal declaration were recorded, and the arms duly exemplified in the Office of Ulster King of Arms of all Ireland, otherwise the said royal license and authority to be void and of none effect. Now these are to declare and certify, that the same have been recorded and certified accordingly.
