WHEREAS His Majesty has been graciously pleased, by licence under his royal signet and sign manual, to give and grant to Philip Newton, jun. of Dunleikny, in the County of Carlow, Esq., His royal authority and permission that he and his issue may take the surname of Bagenal, in lieu of that of Newton, and also to use and bear the armorial ensigns of Bagenal, instead of those of Newton, provided that such His Majesty's concession and royal declaration be first recorded, and the arms duly exemplified in the Office of Ulster King of Arms of all Ireland; otherwise the said royal licence and authority to be void and of none effect: Now, these are to declare and certify that the same has been recorded and exemplified accordingly.
