

ULSTER'S OFFICE,

Dublin Castle, 22d June, 1832.

WHEREAS the King has been graciously pleased to give and grant unto Thomas Cuthbert, of Garretstown, in the County of Cork, Esq., His royal licence and permission that he and his issue may, out of respect to the memory of Thomas Rochfort, late of Garretstown, aforesaid, Esq., deceased, cousin and heir of James Kearny, late of Garretstown, aforesaid, Esq., also deceased, take and use the surname of Kearny, in addition to, and after that of Cuthbert; and also that he and they may use, and bear the armorial ensigns of Kearney, quartered with those of Cuthbert, conformably to the laws of Arms; provided that such His

Majesty's concession and declaration be first recorded, and the arms duly exemplified in the Office of Ulster King of Arms of all Ireland; otherwise the said royal license and authority to be void and of none effect.

Now, these are to declare and certify, that the same have been recorded and exemplified accordingly.
