WHEREAS His Majesty has been graciously pleased, by licence under His royal signet and sign manual, to give and grant to John Allen Carnegy, of Dublin, Esq. His royal permission and authority that he and his issue may henceforward take and use the surname of De Balmhard, in lieu of that of Carnegy, and to use and bear such armorial bearings as may thereupon be assigned to him according to the laws of Arms; provided that such His Majesty's concession and royal declaration be first recorded, and the arms duly exemplified in the Office of Ulster King of Arms of all Ireland, otherwise the said royal licence and authority to be void and of none effect. Now, these are to certify and declare that the same have been recorded and exemplified accordingly.
