

OFFICE OF ARMS.

Dublin Castle, 22d April, 1833.

WHEREAS His Majesty has been graciously pleased, by Warrant under His royal signet and sign manual, bearing date at St. James's-Palace, the 18th of March, 1833, to give and grant to George Dunbar Orr, of Belfast, in the County of Antrim, Esq., (only surviving son of Alexander Orr, of Landmore, in the County of Derry. Esq., by Sarah, his wife, daughter of John Dunbar, of Dungannon, in the County of Tyrone, Esq., and sister of John

Gilmore Dunbar, now of Woburne, in the County of Down, Esq.,) His royal licence and permission, that he and his issue, in compliance with the desire of the said John Gilmore Dunbar, may take and use the surname of Dunbar, instead of that of Orr; and also use and bear the armorial ensigns of Dunbar, instead of those of Orr, provided His Majesty's said royal concession and declaration were first recorded, and the arms duly exemplified in the Office of Ulster King of Arms of all Ireland: Now, these are to certify and declare, that the same has been duly recorded and exemplified accordingly.
