THE Queen has been graciously pleased, by license under the Royal Signet and Sign Manual, to give and grant to Benjamin Geale, of Mount Geale, in the County of Kilkenny, and of the City of Dublin, Esq., Her Majesty's royal license and authority, that he and his issue may take the name and bear the arms of Brady, out of grateful respect to the memory, and in compliance with the wishes of his maternal grandfather, Patrick Brady, late of the City of Dublin, Esq., deceased, provided such Her Majesty's roval concession and declaration be recorded, and the arms duly exemplified in the Office of Ulster King of Arms of all Ireland, that the Officers of Arms there, and all others upon occasion may take full notice and have knowledge thereof, otherwise to be void and of none effect :
