
OFFICE OF ARMS,

Dublin Castle, August 16, 1841.

THE Queen has been graciously pleased, by licence under the Royal Signet and Sign Manual, to give and grant to the Reverend John Robert Fitzgerald, and to the Reverend Edward Fitzgerald, both of Spring-hill, in the county of Kerry, Clerks, Her Majesty's royal licence and authority, that they may assume the name of Day in addition to and after that of Fitzgerald, and bear the arms of Day, in compliance with the wishes, and out of grateful respect to the memory of Robert Day, of Leighlinstown-house, in the county of Dublin, Esq., deceased, late Second Justice of the Court of King's Bench in Ireland ; provided such Her Majesty's royal concession and declaration be recorded, and the arms duly exemplified, in the Office of Ulster King of Arms of all Ireland, that the Officers of Arms there, and all others, on occasion may take full notice and have knowledge thereof, otherwise to be void and of none effect :

These are to notify, that the said royal concession and declaration has been recorded, and the arms duly exemplified accordingly.
