ST. GERMANS.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the 17th and 18th years of the reign of Her present Majesty, entitled, "An Act for the Formation, Regulation, and Government of Convict Prisons in Ireland," it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Lord Lieutenant, by Warrant to be published in the Dublin Gazette, to set apart and appoint places of Confinement, either at land or on board vessels to be provided for that purpose, for Prisoners under Sentence or Order of Transportation, or of Penal Servitude; and all such places of Confinement so set apart and appointed, and all yards, offices, grounds, and premises thereunto pertaining, shall be held to be and considered "Convict Prisons."

Now We, the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, in pursuance of the powers vested in Us by the said Act, do hereby set apart and appoint the building known as the "Old Sheriff's Prison," situated in Green-street, in the County of the City of Dublin, and all yards, offices, grounds, and premises thereunto pertaining, to be a Convict Prison, for the several purposes in the aforesaid Act mentioned.
