CARLISLE.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the 17th and 18th years of Her Majesty's reign, entitled, "An Act for the Formation, Regulation, and Government of Convict Prisons in Ireland," it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Lord Lieutenant, by Warrant to be published in the *Dublin Gazette*, to set apart and appoint Places of Confinement either at Land or on board Vessels to be provided for that purpose, for Prisoners under Sentence or Order of Transportation, or of Penal Servitude; and all such Places of Confinement so set apart and appointed, and all Yards, Offices, Grounds, and Premises thereunto pertaining, shall be held to be and considered "Convict Prisons."

Now We, George William Frederick, Earl of Carlisle, Lord Lieutenant-General and General Governor of Ireland, in pursuance of the power so vested in Us, do hereby set apart and appoint the Townland called the "Race Course Common," in the Parish of Lusk, Barony of Balrothery East, and County of Dublin, containing One Hundred and Twenty-one Acres and Eleven Perches, together with all Offices and Buildings now erected, or which may hereafter be erected thereon, to be a Place of Confinement for Prisoners under Sentence or Order of Transportation, or of Penal Servitude, as aforesaid, and to be and considered a Convict Prison; of which all persons concerned are to take Notice.
